Pastor's Corner



The mission of God in Christ gives shape and substance to the life and work of the Church. Human beings have no higher goal in life than to glorify and enjoy God now and forever, living in covenant fellowship with God and participating in God's mission.

The season of Lent continues throughout the rest of this month and ends on March 31st with the celebration of Christ's resurrection on Easter. Lent is a season of preparation and anticipation. It is a time to re-set oneself and re-focus on God. It is a season of intentionally putting "off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires", as Paul says in Ephesians 4:22-24 and being "renewed in the spirit of your minds, putting on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness." So Lent finds us intentionally putting aside practices or habits that distract us from God in order to replace them with practices or habits that draw us closer to God. We fast from things that distract us from God, so we can grow closer in intimacy with God. As we grow in intimacy with God, we participate with God in His mission, as mentioned in the above quotation. And even if we did not take up any Lenten disciplines, even if we did not give up anything, we can still begin today. As the author of Hebrews reminds us, "God again set a certain day, calling it "Today." This he did when a long time later he spoke through David, as in the passage already quoted: "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts." (Hebrews 4:7) God is calling to us all this day to come, follow Him. When we hear His voice, do not harden your hearts and turn away, do not follow the siren calls of distractions and amusements which really do not satisfy. Rather come to the One who can truly fulfill, who can truly refresh, and who is truly all in all.

As we continue through this Lenten season I encourage you: Today is the day. Today is the first day of the rest of your life. Rather than wait, sitting on the sidelines, join with God in His work. Come live the full and fulfilling life. The eternal life. Join with the whole community of saints who have preceded us in life and death, walking alongside God, experiencing truth, beauty and goodness, and helping the Kingdom of God come here, on earth, as it is in heaven. Join us, won't you?

2024 Lenten Soup Suppers



Topic: *Live No Lies* (book and study by John Mark Comer) We are at war. Not with a foreign government, or domestic terrorists, or a creepy new artificial intelligence hell-bent on taking over the world. Our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world (Eph.6:12). Over the centuries, believers in Christ have come to recognize the enemies of the soul as the world, the flesh, and the devil. These enemies employ the strategies of *deceptive ideas* (the devil), that play to disordered desires (the flesh), that are then normalized in a sinful society (the world). We will join author John Mark Comer as he helps us understand how these enemies of the soul are still at work today, and we will learn practical tools to help us recognize these enemies, resist the lies they try to make us believe, and experience the peace that God intends us to experience.

One Great Hour of Sharing is the annual offering from our church to the PCUSA Special Offerings. Begun 75 years ago...it started with this question from an Episcopalian bishop: "How much money can we raise in an hour to address the suffering in the world?" The desire was to show the power generated when Christians unite in a common cause.

Not long after the Episcopal bishop addressed his congregations, the Presbyterians accepted his challenge and eventually as many as 20 denominations joined the effort. In 1950, this challenge was named "One Great Hour of Sharing."

The Offering's original goal was \$1 million to make the love of Christ real for individuals and communities around the world who suffer from the effects of disaster, conflict or severe economic crisis.

Today, the purpose of One Great Hour of Sharing has remained the same, responding to needs in 100 countries, including the U.S. and Canada. The last time it was reported the funds exceeded \$20 million annually funded by eight denominations.

These funds help to support three focus areas: Disaster Assistance, Hunger Programs, and Self-Development of People. Information on giving will be in the bulletins during the month of March!

The youth of Carpio recently completed their camp retreat. Thanks to the FPC for supporting this ministry!








Mission Committee

Artists from First Presbyterian Church of Hastings are invited to create art that goes along with the Lenten sermon series.



The Worship and Work of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, MI Minutes of the February 26th 2024 Regular Session Meeting

The meeting was held at the Church, 405 N-M37 Highway, Hastings MI in the Adult classroom.

In attendance were Elders Cindy Preston, Sunny Anderson, Dave Allerding, Scott Allerding, Sally Keller, and Moderator Rev. Nick Marlatt. Excused: Elders Steve Laubaugh, Gary Kimble, Sandra Billingsley, Kim Bosma, Linda McGuire and Absent: John Johnston

A quorum was established and Pastor Nick opened the meeting with prayer at 7:05 pm and a reading from John 4:27-42, followed by a reflection from the Lenten devotional "God For Us". Portraying a beautiful and apt comparison of people as sidetracked flower girls in a wedding & God being the smiling Pastor up front beckoning them forward.

Consent Agenda containing Minutes from the January Regular Session meeting and the Congregational Meeting Minutes from Feb 4th was approved.

Clerk's Report: No correspondence was received. The Pastor's Terms of Call for 2024 and the PCUSA I Statistical Report have been filed.

Pastor's Report There is a Presbytery Meeting March 9th, Sally will let Nick know if she can attend by the end of the week. There are Boundary Trainings being held online that would fulfill the requirement from the Book of Order for sexual Misconduct training. There are 2 sessions limited to 40 people each, April 13th and June 1st. Cindy will attend June 1st.

Mark Lute needs to be ordained as a Deacon, and the rest of the newly elected officers need to be installed, Nick is planning to do that Sunday the 10th if Mark Lute is available.

Training was completed for the incoming Elders & Deacons Jan 28th.

A new Member's class will be held after Easter with them hoping to join on Pentecost.

A reading "homework" assignment was distributed of 2 chapters of a governing and ministry book. Please read it by the next meeting. It reminds us of our goals and gives a historical overview of Mainline Protestant churches in America, and how "we" got to where we are today.

Worship & Work of the Session

Personnel Report We are one custodian down, conversations with Rick and Wanda are happening about returning on a part-time basis and there is a plan to cover preschool cleanup if necessary.

Trustees -broken glass in the stairway appears to have broken itself. There was a motion to approve the Trustees meeting every-other month in the even months. It passed.

Worship & Music - Scott can fill-in for Sally serving communion this Sunday. There are open dates still for serving. We will circulate the sign-up sheet next month. Kim is moderating this committee this year.

Financial & Stewardship - Please see the report. **NAPS** The registration Banners will go out March 5th for registration from the community. Regarding the sign, they are not interested in being on the "church for all ages" section of the sign. We discussed adding extra slides to the rotation on the digital section.

Family Ministry The Spring Hill trip was wonderful! No injuries this year! There will be a video Sunday in church. Discussion was about being all in 10 Sr. High and 14 Middle Schoolers attended, with chaperones. DJ Code was back, and we are hoping to hire him for the combined youth group event (Community Bash 2.0) in March at the community center.

Deacons/Mission No action items

Nomination Committee Cindy Preston agreed to Chair the Nomination Committee. Kim Bosma will be the second Elder. We need a designated Deacon. Members at large were elected at the congregational meeting.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer by Pastor Nick at 8:00 pm
