

To all God's beloved children at First Presbyterian Church,

I hope this finds you all well as we turn toward the end of the Church year on Christ the King Sunday. Christ the King is the last Sunday before Advent begins. Each year the Church year begins on the first Sunday of Advent. This year Christ the King is on Sunday, November 26 while Advent begins on Sunday, December 3. I bring this up because we are tempted to jump right from Thanksgiving to Christmas this time of year. The constant Black Friday commercials as well as Christmas music on the radio and Christmas displays, which seem to appear in stores earlier each year, can make it a challenge for those of us who want to enter the Advent season in a contemplative way.

The season of Advent (the four weeks before Christmas Day) has long been a season in the Church of quiet anticipation for the coming of Jesus. During the season of Advent, we remember the many years and centuries that the people of God waited for the long-prophesied Messiah who eventually arrived in the birth of Jesus. The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year because it is where the story of Jesus begins. During the season of Advent we assume a posture of waiting. We intentionally enter into the story as it happened for those who came before us: with anticipation, with groaning, with longing, with hope.

Prayer is one of the spiritual practices which best helps us to slow down, wait for Christ and keep us aware of the presence of God. The congregation will provide an Advent devotional, which I encourage you to utilize as a way of slowing down and connecting to God in through prayer. Prayer is also one of the hallmark characteristics I desire for this congregation. I have found this congregation to be a praying congregation and I am so encouraged by your devotion to prayer. To that end, the deacons are tweaking the prayer request guidelines for the congregation. Prayers will be classified as either confidential or public based on the request of the person asking for prayer. Confidential prayers will be placed in the "purple Prayer Box" at the connection point and I will pray for these. All other prayers will be classified as public and will be published in the weekly printed order of worship and emailed to the congregation so we all can be in prayer for the needs of our church family.

I look forward to remaining in prayer with you for our church family and the world.

Minutes of the November 27th 2023 Regular Session Meeting

The meeting was held at the Church, 405 N-M37 Highway, Hastings MI in the Adult classroom.

In attendance were Elders Cindy Preston, Gary Kimble, Sunny Anderson, Dave Allerding, Tracy Solmes, Sally Keller, Larry Winkler, Sandra Billingsley, Scott Allerding, Kim Bosma, Steve Laubaugh, Jim Bruce, and Moderator Rev. Nick Marlatt. Absent: Elder Michael Behrendt,

A quorum was established and Pastor Nick opened the meeting with prayer at 7:02 followed by a reading from the book "

The Consent Agenda containing Minutes from the October Regular Session Meeting and tonight's Agenda was approved.

Clerk Report: We received a sanctuary use request from Bob Oster and the Lakewood Choral Society for the Dec 17th Concert, with a free will offering to benefit charity and 20% coming back to the church. The request was approved. We will record the deaths of Larry Melendy member number 1012 and Marjory Barcroft member number 38. Both funerals were held here last week.

Pastor's Report, Larry Winkler was elected a Commissioner to the Presbytery Meeting next Tuesday, as he is attending with Pastor Nick at Forest Hills Presbyterian. A letter to the Curtis' was circulated regarding our regret that they have chosen to leave our congregation, along with best wishes. The draft was approved and Session members will sign it. The LGBTQ+ statement task force rough draft statement on what we believe was distributed. We were encouraged to read it through, suggest edits via email to Pastor Nick and be prepared to vote on it next month.

Personnel Report An Evaluation Summary of Pastor Nicks review was circulated. He is meeting or exceeding all our expectations and standards. The full evaluation is available upon request. Zoey Zinney is recommended for hire as our Children's Ministry Director. She reports to Family Ministries and Pastor Nick. Her hiring was approved. The operations manual for 2024 is nearly ready, should be good for December, Custodian interviews are ongoing.

Trustees No meeting this month but projects are ongoing, the gas fireplace project hit the irrigation lines, so that damage will need to be fixed. More expenses are coming on the RTU's about \$13,000 worth, which would run over the trustee's budget, it involves computerized valves and controllers.

Worship & Music The Outdoor Nativity will be put up Saturday, other than that decorations are done. December 24th is a Sunday so it will have a 10 am 4th Sunday of Advent Service, and a 6:00 pm Christmas Eve Service, and Monday the 25th will be a 10:00 am very casual and simple Christmas Day service. A mitten offering was also approved for the Christmas Eve service.

pledges will be invested in a 6 month CD.

Financial & Stewardship Gary shared an article from the Michigan History Magazine about Hannah Harkness Love who was married in our church in Jan 1936. She was a female pilot. A bit of legacy. Ned predicts our 2023 finances may come in as nearly balanced (as opposed to the -70,000 budget) The Presbytery has asked us for our pledge to support their shared missions. Recently we have been giving \$8,000 after discussion a motion was made to divide this \$8000 in half \$4000 to Presbytery and \$4000 to our own mission committee, it was seconded discussion was held, and the motion failed. A second motion was made to give the Presbytery Shared Missions \$2,000 and our Mission Committee \$6,000. The motion was seconded and passed. It was also agreed to concur with the recommended percentages.

Gary also provided a worksheet regarding the current pledge drive. 65 of 79 units have pledged. Currently if looks like we will have again a deficit budget of approximately \$80,000. Those 15 giving units may yet come in. Reminder letters will go out. 50% of our pre-paid

NAPs Christmas Bedtime Stories and sing alongs will be Dec 15th. Congregation is invited. \$2000 was received from the Messer Trust fund. NAPS is receiving requests to expand to a larger school. (K-3rd or something like that) Angie will investigate what that would actually take We can't make any sort of decision without more information.

Family Ministry 25 kids and 8 leaders would like permission to attend Spring Hill winter retreat. The trip was approved; leader's names will be submitted before the trip. They would also like to hold a pancake fundraiser on Dec. 17th in support of the trip. That was supported and approved. On Dec. 9th they would like to receive donations of teenage age Christmas gifts in support of United Way's Christmas Program. Request approved. Family Ministry Team members are desperately needed, It's currently staff and Scott.

Deacons/Mission Love Tree is ongoing, the tags were all taken. The families were selected through South Eastern School and NAPS and not thru Barry County Cares. The South Eastern Mentor program was recognized at the school board meeting Jim Bruce and his birdhouse building program presented. The Costa Rican team had a successful trip and many came back with Covid (15 of the 27) the Costa Rican church recognized Jim Spindler, it was very nice. He was gifted a couple of pieces of art from a local artist. A motion was made to approve for the Costa Rican kids camp donations to be collected by us, and transferred to Costa Rica at the end of the ask. Camp costs about \$150, per child, Supported and approved. The Mission Committee will direct some of the endowment fund dollars toward this project.

The Nominating Committee consists of Elders Jim Bruce, and Kim Bosma, Deacon Bernie Oom and Members at Large: Debbie Rang, Dale Billingsley, Eldon Cassell, and Lisa Brown. They are on target and waiting for some nominated candidates to prayerfully consider their requests.

New Business: Reminder it's scam season and Pastor Nick will never text or email anyone for donations.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer by Nick Marlatt at 9:11 pm.
